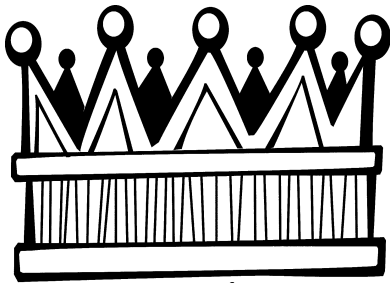

Christ the King - Year A

Next week's readings: First Sunday of Advent— Isaiah 63:16-17; 64:1,3-8, 1 Corinthians 1:3—9; Mark 13:31-37.

FEAST FOR THE INSIGNIFICANT



**Reign of Christ
Christ the King**

The Church's proclamation of Jesus Christ as King combined with today's Gospel conjures up popular images of a crowned, glorious, and majestic King. Sitting on a royal throne, He justly determines the eternal fate of every human being. These images arise from our fertile imaginations as seen in the rich history of our religious art. They inspire anxiety when we imagine ourselves before Him to be judged. We hope that He will mercifully rank us among the sheep!

However, a close scrutiny of today's Gospel text would surely challenge us to re-examine these images of Christ's Kingship. The parable of the Last Judgment unveils for us in a surprising and even shocking manner the true identity of our real King and Judge. Look at the characters in the parable: the hungry and thirsty, the stranger, the sick, the naked, and the prisoner. These are the poor, the insignificant, the unattractive, the vulnerable, the hidden, and those serving time. Jesus made it crystal clear that they are our real and final Judges because he identifies with them. Whatever is done, or not done, to them is considered done, or not done to Him. Our responses to them will qualify us as either "blessed of my Father" or "the cursed".

In our contemporary cultural experience the market is the driving force. But today's message is a direct challenge of tsunamic proportion to this market-driven culture. The market fetes and rewards the powerful, the rich and the gifted. In this culture, people are not really important. Economic expansion and numbers are what really count. Those who count are those who could help boost the economy.

Today's feast declares clearly the **significance of the insignificant**. In particular the little and forgotten ones are the ones who are truly significant in the eyes of God. Our King asks us to consider the place we give to human beings in our lives, especially those who are on the margins, downtrodden, poor, and unwanted. He asks us to raise serious questions about the kind of values and priorities affecting the ways we organise and live our lives. As humans and subjects of Jesus, He wills that these insignificant and forgotten people will judge us by our responses to them.

Our responses could be so insignificant and seemingly mundane that don't attract notice. We can act in the form of simple and small but tender acts of mercy—such as the giving food, water, clothing, housing the stranger, caring for the sick, and visiting the imprisoned. Christ tells us that in them He still suffers and that in them His Body is still broken. Do not be surprised therefore that our judges will be those we may have met before. We may have served or neglected to serve them. Yet these seemingly little acts of mercy and kindness determine who we are forever.

More Thoughts on the Gospel

'The sheep are clearly very surprised - they hardly remember doing these things. And certainly they do not remember ever doing anything of the kind for Jesus. "Just as you did it to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me." Then turning to the goats, whom he calls "accursed", he condemns them for not doing any of the things he mentioned above and for not recognising Jesus in their brothers and sisters.

'There are a number of things to notice here:

- none of the things Jesus mentions are religious in nature
- there is no mention whatever of any commandments being observed or violated
- people are condemned not for doing actions which were morally wrong but for not doing anything at all
- the actions are done (or not done) TO Jesus and not just FOR Jesus. In other words, Jesus is truly present in every person I meet. I am not just nice to this person (whom I may not care about very much) in order to do a "good act" which Jesus will reward and add to my bank account of "good works". People cannot be used - even for spiritual purposes.'

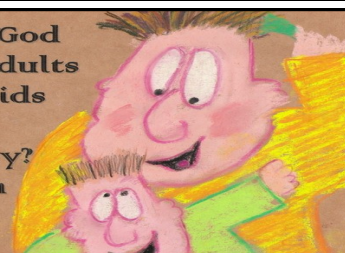

REFLECTION: FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

First reading: Ezekiel 34: 11-12, 15-17.

Here God is compared to a shepherd - of Old Testament times! He has concern, is caring and over-sees his flock. What a lovely image for us to have of our shepherd God! Is this my current image?

Responsorial Psalm: Ps. 22: 1-3, 5-6.

Probably the best known and loved psalm, - but let me listen to it as if it was for the first time, - and reflect on the first reading, - and take an important message for myself in my life.

Second reading: 1 Cor. 15: 20-26, 28.

This is almost a complete account of the beginning and the end of the human race, and the part that we and God have had to play in it. But notice that at the end of it all, God is the King of all!

Gospel: Matthew 25: 31-46.

Here Matthew sums up Christ's public ministry. Which group will I be in when the end of the world comes? Let me continue to do good to others, - starting with those of my own family.

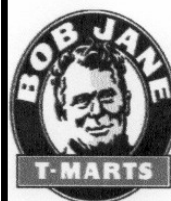
