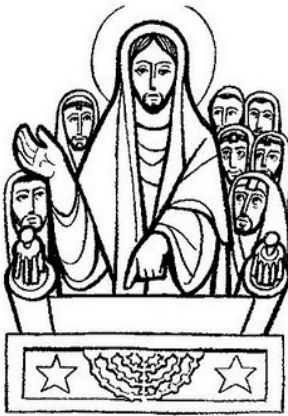

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year B

Next week's readings: Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time— Job 7:1—4, 6—7; 1 Corinthians 9:16—19, 22—23; Mark 1:29—39

Review of Life



In today's gospel, we see Jesus at the start of his public ministry, joining with the local people in the synagogue at Capernaum. First of all, he taught the people. We see the effects of his preaching: the people were deeply impressed and compared him favourably to their other teachers. Jesus spoke with the authority of God his Father.

Following his teaching, he was then confronted by a man possessed by an evil spirit. Without any elaborate ceremonial, Jesus simply said to the evil spirit: "Be quiet! Come out of him". The people were astounded that a man had such power over evil spirits and they spread the news all through the neighbourhood. Jesus spoke and acted with the authority of God.

Let's reflect for a few minutes on the man possessed by the unclean spirit. He could be a symbol of each of us. Here was a man who was troubled by an evil spirit and yet had come along to the synagogue. So the spirit had some control over him but not total.

I wonder if we have an unclean spirit within us. Not anything really bad but something that is stopping us from giving ourselves completely to God. That is our calling, to love God with our whole heart and to love one another as Jesus has loved us. Most of us do not do this 100%. There is always something holding us back. We come to Mass on Sundays and we say some prayers during the week. We might even do some charitable work. But we have faults and failings. Often we take little notice of our faults. Sometimes people even boast about them: "I believe in speaking my mind". The fact that they hurt someone is of no concern to them. This is the difference between saints and us. The saints are much more aware of their faults and take them much more seriously. When they talk about themselves as great sinners and ungrateful to God, we think it is an exaggeration. However, because they have such a delicate conscience, they look on little faults as bad.

There are many faults that could be keeping us from committing ourselves completely to God. Some drivers get very impatient and this can lead to road rage. Perhaps we have a quick temper which affects harmony in the home. Maybe we are selfish and think of our comfort first. Perhaps we use our position in our job to harass junior members of the staff. We might gamble too much, wasting money that is needed in the home. Our fault might be unnecessary buying. Perhaps we make no effort to protect our environment.

It is useful to do a brief examination of conscience each night. Just to review the day and see the good things we did, and then the failings. As we become more aware of our weak points, let us ask Jesus with great confidence for healing.

The Sacredness of Work

'Thank God for work, sometimes that's the only thing that sits between us and unbearable melancholy. Work is a wonderful, God-given, thing. Too often work is seen as something that takes us away from the God and prayer, a distraction to the spiritual life. Hard work is admitted to be a good, honest thing, but, even so, never a holy thing in itself, a gift from God so that we can be co- creators with Him.

'We have to spend most of our waking lives working. That should tell us something, namely, that work must be the major avenue through which God wants us to journey towards the deeper things. Given the way we are built and the way life is shaped, God surely does not expect us to consciously think about Him most of our waking moments. God is not an egotistical tyrant, demanding our conscious attention, even while we have to work long hours amidst all the heartaches, headaches, restlessness, anxieties, fears, and preoccupations that impale themselves upon us every waking minute. If God wants our conscious attention every waking minute, then there is some fatal flaw in the way we are built and the way life is set up.

'But there is no fatal flaw. God is the ground of our being, the ground too of our work and our relationships. In God "we live and move and have our being." We know God not just in our conscious awareness and in prayer, but also in a deep inchoate way, by participating with Him in building this world - by growing things, building things, carving things, creating things, cleaning things, painting things, writing things, raising children, nursing bodies, teaching others, consoling others, humouring others, struggling with others, and loving others. Work, like prayer, is a privileged way to get to know God because, when we work, we are toiling in partnership with Him.

Walks vary from easy to challenging, from day trips to overnights. The club provides training in walking safely, how to be environmentally conscious and improves leadership skills.

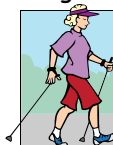

A time to smile

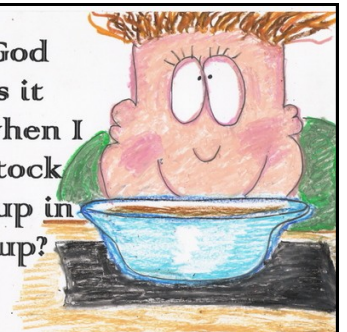

First reading: *Deut 18.15-20.*

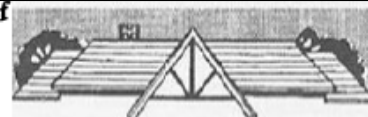
