Comfort with a Catch

(Mark 1:1-8)

"There's good news, and there's bad news". A whole body of jokes begin this way, and we laugh ruefully because that statement is generally true. The news is hardly ever good or bad, but rather a blend of results better for some than others. One ball team beats another; is this good news, or bad?

John the Baptist preaches repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Good news or bad? It's great news for sinners who repent. It's good news for people who yearn to be forgiven and know they have reason to be. It's not good news for people who have no intention of leaving their sin behind. And its positively bad news for the self-righteous, convinced of their innocence and resentful that sinful types are getting off the hook.

The message of John the Baptist is comfort with a catch. The catch is baptism, a drowning to the old way and a resurrection into grasping new life. We can't find comfort in religion – not this religion! – if we intend to remain just as we are. John's baptism is with water, bracing and cold. The Mighty One is coming along soon with fire and spirit. Things are going to change.

How does the message of John comfort you? How does it challenge you?



Our Second Advent candle is called the Bethlehem Candle or the Candle of Peace. It reminds us of when Jesus Christ, Prince of Peace was born in the small town of Bethlehem and came among us as a baby. This candle also reminds us that Jesus promised to come again. By the light of this candle we wait in patience for Jesus.



WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY, MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENTS:

RECENT ACTIVITIES - continued cleaning and painting OSHC internal walls, repairs to corroded church/school gutters, 6-monthly fire systems checks in Presbytery, parish Office and OSHC building.

CURRENT TASKS NEEDING TO BE DONE - deep clean of presbytery carpets before new priest arrives (scheduled Saturday 16th Dec), repair/replace several taps in presbytery, annual carpet deep clean in OSHC (scheduled Saturday 16th Dec), paint OSHC verandah wall, repairs to kitchen cupboards in OSHC, re-oiling of OSHC verandah deck, removal of mould and sanding/ painting of presbytery window sills doors and door frames (scheduled for 2024), repair/replace damaged fence panel in church carpark (on hold), painting of presbytery gutters and eaves (on hold).

POSSIBLE FUTURE PROJECTS DEPENDING ON AVAILABILITY OF FUNDING - replace rotted-out fence posts (presbytery yard fence along side school oval), plaster repairs to ceilings in presbytery.



A Notice from Fr Rony

On the Second Sunday of Advent, we light the second purple candle- "the Candle of Peace". One of the hallmarks of the Christmas story is when the angels appear to the shepherds and proclaim, "Peace on earth,"

Jesus brought about peace, in the most unexpected ways, when he arrived. The Jews, particularly the zealots, wanted a rebellion. They wanted their Saviour to overturn the oppressive rule of the Romans and bring about peace in a violent way. But Jesus had something else in mind. Jesus brings us peace in several ways.

First, he gives us inner peace. Because of his work on the cross, we have a chance to receive salvation and be indwelled by the Holy Spirit. This grants us an inner peace. Not only do we have the peace that comes from our assurance of salvation, but we also have the peace of mind of knowing God will heal this broken world and will come again.

Second, we have peace with others. We put aside our differences, especially with other believers, because we belong to the same family. We have the same purpose: to let others know about the peace of Christ. The Peace of God allows us to look at others through Heaven's eyes and help guide the world to see God's kingdom. As a worshipping community, let us pray together for the World peace.

May the God of peace ignite the hearts of world leaders to act prudently to be the ambassadors of Peace.


