# GOSPEL REFLECTION "MOST WE WAIT FOR ANOTHER?" No one ever born was greater than John the Baptist, by Jesus' own admission. And yet even John found it hard to keep patient while Jesus wandered through the first season of his ministry. From prison, John heard the reports of Jesus teaching, healing, gathering crowds to hear the word of God. He didn't hear what he had expected: Jesus proclaiming his kingship, Claiming Jerusalem as his capital, denouncing the Romans or the Temple leaders, and "laying the axe to the root of the tree," once and for all. John had preached the coming destruction, and Jesus seemed, well, more lamb than God. It was hard for John not to be disappointed, and to wonder for a moment if he had misread Jesus altogether. Suss doesn't chide John for lacking faith. Instead, he quotes prophecy to reassure John that God's time of favour has arrived. Workplace Health and Safety, Maintenance and Improvements: <u>RECENT ACTIVITIES</u>: cleaned walls on shady side of presbytery prior to timber repairs and painting, obtaining quote to remove dead/dying trees beside parish office, obtaining quote for removal of trees alongside boundary fence beside presbytery (roots in drains), started removing rotting timbers from garden edges and buildings (to reduce possible termite activity), re-supported fence being blown over in wind (presbytery yard fence along side school oval).

**CURRENT TASKS NEEDING TO BE DONE**: – high-pressure water-blast pathway leading to church, polishing vinyl flooring in church, implement repairs to stop water leaks (wall in priest sacristy, ceiling above reconciliation facility, gutter outside toilets), obtain quote for Termite Management system renewal around the church building, fix/replace damaged fence railing at OSHC, remove dead/dying trees beside parish office (urgent), remove trees alongside boundary fence beside presbytery (roots in drains), investigate leaking ladies toilet in church, investigate malfunctioning light at entrance to ladies toilet.

**POSSIBLE FUTURE PROJECTS DEPENDING ON AVAILABILITY OF FUNDING**: replace rotted-out fence posts (presbytery yard fence along side school oval), repaint inside walls of presbytery, replace/repair rusted-out gutter at chapel end of church building.
