## **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

#### "I'm the One, All Right"

A fellow who used to sit and beg becomes the one who stands and gives witness. The one they knew as the man born blind becomes the only one with clear sight. Are we surprised? This is the way with God's people. The last are first. The meek inherit the earth. The loser takes all, and the crucified one is raised from the dead, it all makes Christian sense.

The Pharisees who question the man call themselves disciples of Moses, but in fact they follow their own sense of how the world works. Blind people stay blind, sinners break Sabbath law. For Jesus to come and cure the blind man on the Sabbath upsets the apple cart of reason and piety. This is unacceptable to those who consider themselves religious. Even God, after all, has to keep to the divine place! It can be particularly true of religious people that we want the Sacred to remain inert in the Tabernacle to be worshipped. If Holy Power escapes into the world, who can be safe from its freedom to act?

Pray—Persistent God, what have you tried to plant in our hearts this Lent? We live in a world that seems to pay no attention to you, and we wonder if we are, in fact, good soil. We can help each other to hear you. May we bear fruit through perseverance Amen.

**Ponder**—God likes to colour outside the lines. Invite God to expand your sense of what is right, acceptable and good. Ask that your blindness be healed, and that you be given clear sight.

### Workplace Health and Safety, Maintenance and Improvements:

<u>RECENT ACTIVITIES</u> – OSHC building extension inspected by Certifier, re-installed storage cabinets in OSHC building, relocated wall hangings on back wall of church, removed filing cabinets/records from OSHC building to archive storage. <u>CURRENT TASKS NEEDING TO BE DONE</u> – repair cracked window in OSHC building, install security screens on OSHC building extension, install roller blinds in OSHC building extension, repair/replace damaged fence panel in church carpark, painting of presbytery gutters and eaves, removal of trees alongside boundary fence beside presbytery (roots in drains), polishing vinyl flooring in church, implement repairs to stop water leaks (wall in priest sacristy, ceiling above reconciliation facility, gutter outside toilets), renewal of Termite Management system around the church building (quote obtained).

<u>POSSIBLE FUTURE PROJECTS DEPENDING ON AVAILABILITY OF FUNDING</u> – replace rotted-out fence posts (presbytery yard fence along side school oval), repaint inside walls of presbytery, replace/repair rusted-out gutter at chapel end of church building.
