" Friendship in the Bread "

Church people use a lot of religious language to describe what we believe in: salvation, resurrection, communion. But in our rituals, we use very familiar signs to explain what me mean by all this. Eucharist is one of these. Oh, for the pleasure of a meal with friends!

Friendship is a kind of sacrament all its own. We share histories with our friends. We tell the story of our lives and find common ground. And when we come together, we share food. The warmth and comfort of a meal reflects the nature of our relationship with one another. We celebrate the union of our hearts around the table.

In the unique gathering of our Eucharist, we also acknowledge the great story of our God and our relationship with the Holy One through Jesus Christ. Our eyes are opened in this meal to recognise the common ground we hold with divinity: the reign of God itself. Our relationship with God through Christ is true yesterday, today, and forever. This is what our faith means. Everything we need to know about God is in this meal.

Reshaping Parish Communities

"Our current structures are based upon the facts of an

earlier time and our current mode of provision is

unsustainable. In the cities at least we have too many parishes and too many churches. Urban parishes were

established on the assumption that people had to be able to walk to church and at a time when the numbers attening Mass were much larger. Many of our parishes

are pressed financially and cannot provide the range of services which a missionary Church requires.

Therefore, we need—sensibly and overtime—to move towards larger configurations of a community of

communities where the concentration of personnel and

the sharing of resources would allow a greater range of

services for the sake of the Gospel."

RECENT ACTIVITIES - installed First Aid kit on back wall of church

CURRENT TASKS NEEDING TO BE DONE - repairs to Church Men's toilet (leaking), repairs to corroded church/school gutters (quote pending), repair/replace damaged fence panel in church carpark, painting of presbytery gutters and eaves, removal of trees alongside boundary fence beside presbytery (roots in drains), polishing vinyl flooring in church, implement repairs to stop water leaks (wall in priest sacristy, ceiling above reconciliation facility, gutter outside toilets), renewal of Termite Management system around the church building (guote obtained). POSSIBLE FUTURE PROJECTS DEPENDING ON AVAILABILITY OF FUNDING - replace rotted-out fence posts (presbytery yard fence along side school oval), repaint inside walls of presbytery, replace/repair rusted-out gutter at chapel end of church building.
