Like Leaves in the Wind

(Mark 13:33-37)

I've known several people in the last three years who were told by their doctors they were terminally ill. In each case, these folks immediately made decisions about their lives that they'd been delaying until now. People who know they're dying can't afford to save anything until later. There may not be a "later". There's only now.

The rest of us are kidding ourselves if we think we're not dying: not now, not any time soon, maybe never. When Jesus says, "Be watchful!", we think he means the other guy. We put our faith squarely in "later". Some of us belong to the Church of Later, in which we fully intend to be good, spiritual, faithful people - at a future time to be announced.

Some of us may live to a satisfying old age and wear out with a smile. Some of us will get a deadline from our doctors and have some lead time to prepare. Many of us are left in the dark as to when we'll die or how. This can make us sloppy about the way we live, even arrogant about it. Not taking death seriously is a real mistake in the spiritual life. The church's wisdom is to remind us, right from the start of the church year, that mortality is just what it says it is: a short-term proposition.

The first weekend of Advent means the blessing of the Wreath and Candles. The circle of the wreath, without and beginning or an end, symbolises God's unending love for us and reminds us of eternity. The evergreen leaves represented growth and hopes of eternal life. The symbol of evergreens is rather lost in our part of the world, so Australian gum leaves, nuts and flowers are sometimes substituted.



Our first Advent Candle is the Prophet Candle or the Candle of Hope because it reminds us of the prophets - those who spoke God's word to the people during the hundreds of years before Jesus was born. The prophets gave the people

hope by telling them about God.

RECENT ACTIVITIES - repaired inside walls of OSHC building and started painting OSHC verandah wall and internal walls,.

CURRENT TASKS NEEDING TO BE DONE - repairs to corroded church/school gutters (scheduled 7th Dec), deep clean of presbytery carpets before new priest arrives (scheduled Saturday 16th Dec), repair/replace several taps in presbytery, annual carpet deep clean in OSHC (scheduled Saturday 16th Dec), repairs to kitchen cupboards in OSHC, re-oiling of OSHC verandah deck, removal of mould and sanding/ painting of presbytery window sills doors and door frames (scheduled for 2024), repair/replace damaged fence panel in church carpark (on hold), painting of presbytery gutters and eaves (on hold).

A Notice from Fr Rony

Today Church begins a new liturgical Year and Season of Advent. Advent means waiting or coming and we wait for the coming of someone we love. The Advent season is a time of preparation for our hearts and minds for the anniversary of the Lord's birth on Christmas. During this season we focus on waiting for the Lord, waiting for the coming of Jesus. During Advent we look forward to Jesus who will come in a total gesture of love: God becomes man. The Gospel of Mark invites all to a spiritual vigilance. He tells us all to be ever alert so that the coming of the Son does not find us unprepared for no one knows the day or hour of his coming. The Main attractions of the Advent Season are Wreath and Advent Candles. The use of the wreath and candles during

Advent is full of symbolism tied to the Christmas season. The wreath itself, which is made of various evergreens, signifies continuous life. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul,

and the everlasting life we find in Christ. The candles also have their own special significance. The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent, and one candle is lit each Sunday. Three of the candles are purple because the colour violet is a liturgical colour that signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice.

The first candle, which is purple, symbolizes hope. It is sometimes called the "Prophecy Candle" in remembrance of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. It represents the expectation felt in anticipation of the coming Messiah.

Like the prophets in the Old Testament, we hope for a Messiah to save us from the sin in the world (Isaiah 9:6-7). We anticipate our Saviour's arrival. Also known as the

"Prophecy Candle", this candle assures us we can have hope that God will fulfil the prophecies declared in the Old Testament about Jesus. Hope doesn't disappoint us (Romans 5:5).

On this first Sunday of Advent, let us be hopeful in our lives and continue to trust in our God who is the God of Hope.
