
The Holy Anger of Jesus - John 2: 13 - 25

Why does Jesus lash out in the temple? Because he was mad? Many sermons we hear about the cleansing of the temple are about the holy anger of Jesus. But the remarkable violence Jesus unleashes – destroying property, whipping men and animals out of the temple – is about more than righteous anger. Jesus is establishing his claim on God's house.

Who lives in God's house? That's like asking who's buried in Grant's Tomb. When Jesus throws everybody else out (in Mark's gospel story, Jesus blocks the entrances and won't let anyone pass through), Jesus is saying that he alone has a right claim to his Father's house. Jesus acts like any homeowner who discovers squatters in his living room. He forcibly ejects them.

John's gospel is told as a book of signs, pointing to the full divinity of Jesus. If the other three gospels show us intimate details of Jesus' humanity, John focuses primarily on Jesus' divine identity. The taking of the temple is a powerful display of sovereignty that's unmistakable. In the end, it's Jesus' claims about the temple that are raised at his trial and lead to his death.

Jesus claims God's house. As a child of God, how do you stand in relationship to God's house?

WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY, MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENTS:

<u>RECENT ACTIVITIES</u> – replaced refrigerator in Presbytery, leveling up of grass walkway into OSHC building, installed valve pit for presbytery water isolation valve

<u>CURRENT TASKS NEEDING TO BE DONE</u> – clean urinal in church men's toilet, complete the painting of OSHC verandah wall, removal of mould and sanding/ painting of presbytery window sills doors and door frames (scheduled for 2024), repair/replace damaged fence panel in church carpark (on hold), painting of presbytery gutters and eaves (on hold).
