GOSPEL REFLECTION

The disciples are called "the salt of the earth" and "the light of the world". Consequently, their success will rest on not drawing attention to themselves. As salt is used for preservation and purification, the disciples are called to preserve what is good and purify what hinders God's reign. They cannot allow themselves to become "tasteless salt" that is diluted or dissolved by the cares and worries of the world. As light moves beyond itself and illumines objects in a room, the disciples are called to look beyond themselves by doing good works. This will lead others to glorify God, whom Matthew, for the first time, refers to as "your heavenly Father".

Pray- Lord of all creation, you call us to be salt and light. As salt, we are called to draw out and enhance God's love in the world. As light, we are called to live for the sake of others. As salt and light, may we never draw attention to ourselves. Amen.

Ponder- How will I live out my vocation as salt and light?

Kids' Corner—You are called to let your light shine with the love of Jesus. Your words and actions show others who Jesus is. If you are kind and caring, others will see Jesus as kind and caring. In this way, we bring hope to the lives of other people.

Look for ways to let the light of Jesus shine through you. You might tell someone that Jesus loves them. You could invite a new child to play a game at lunch. Or you might spend time with someone who is sad. What is one way you can let your light shine? Pray about it today. Jesus, help me shine my light so others can see your love. Amen

A Notice from Fr Ladu

THE IMPORTANCE OF THE WORD OF GOD

In fact, there were two documents about Scripture released by the Holy See on 30 September - one in 2019 and the other in 2020. They mark the 1600th anniversary of the death of St Jerome, the great Scripture scholar who prepared the definitive translation of the Bible into Latin. The first document institutes the Sunday of the Word of God, intended to help people to grow in religious and intimate familiarity with the sacred Scriptures. The second gives an account of St Jerome, his scholarship, his faith and his "living and tender love" of the Word of God. Jerome is proposed as a model for enculturating the Gospel and discovering Christ for our time.

Most are no doubt familiar with the saying of Vatican II: "the Church has always venerated the divine Scriptures as she has venerated the Lord's body ... offering people the bread of life from the one table of the Word of God and the body of Christ (Dei Verbum 21)." In the same vein, the second document quotes St Jerome: "We are reading the sacred Scriptures. For me, the Gospel is the body of Christ; for me, the holy Scriptures are his teaching. And when he says: 'whoever does not eat my flesh and drink my blood' (Jn 6:53), even though these words can also be understood of the [eucharistic] Mystery, Christ's body and blood are really the word of Scripture, God's teaching."

RECENT ACTIVITIES: – Installation of chapel leadlight windows.

<u>CURRENT TASKS NEEDING TO BE DONE</u>: – repair to plaster wall in Chapel (caused by statue bracket), repair/replace malfunctioning light at entrance to ladies toilet, painting of presbytery gutters and eaves, removal of trees alongside boundary fence beside presbytery (roots in drains), polishing vinyl flooring in church, implement repairs to stop water leaks (wall in priest sacristy, ceiling above reconciliation facility, gutter outside toilets), renewal of Termite Management system around the church building (quote obtained).

POSSIBLE FUTURE PROJECTS DEPENDING ON AVAILABILITY OF FUNDING: - replace rotted-out fence posts (presbytery yard fence along side school oval), repaint inside walls of presbytery, replace/repair rusted out gutter at chapel end öf church building.
